In Ireland many people once believed that the sun danced for joy on Easter Sunday morning.

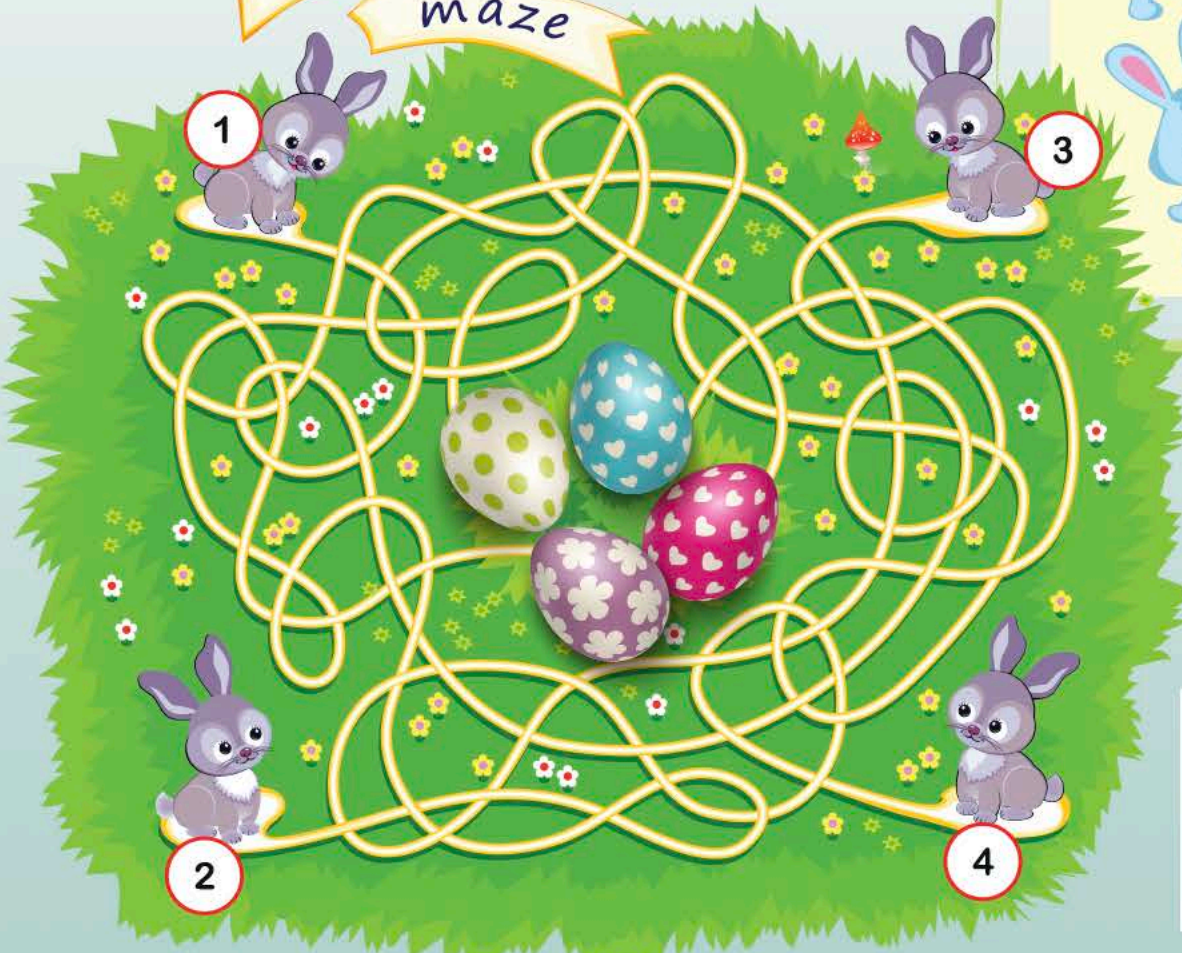

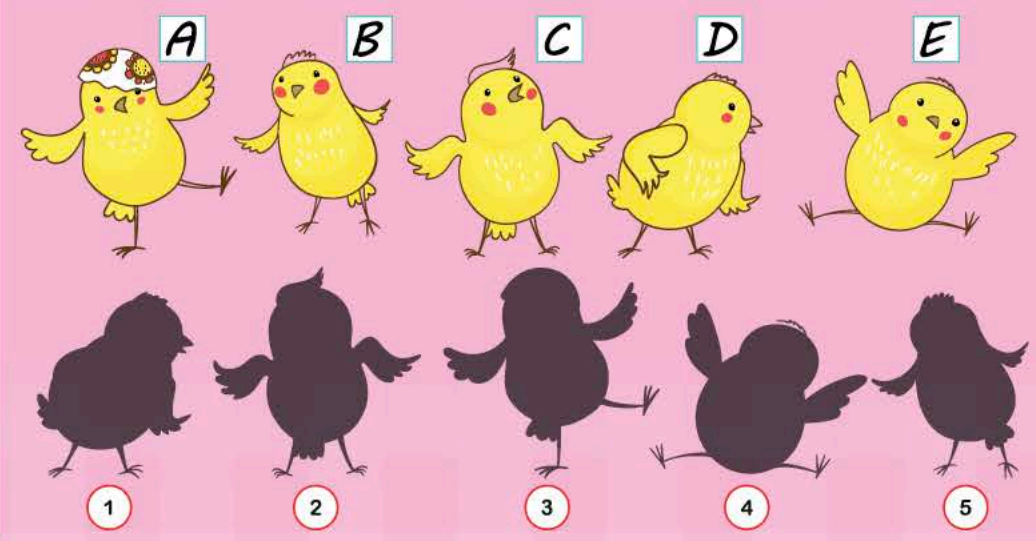

In the past people in Ireland did not eat eggs during *Lent*.

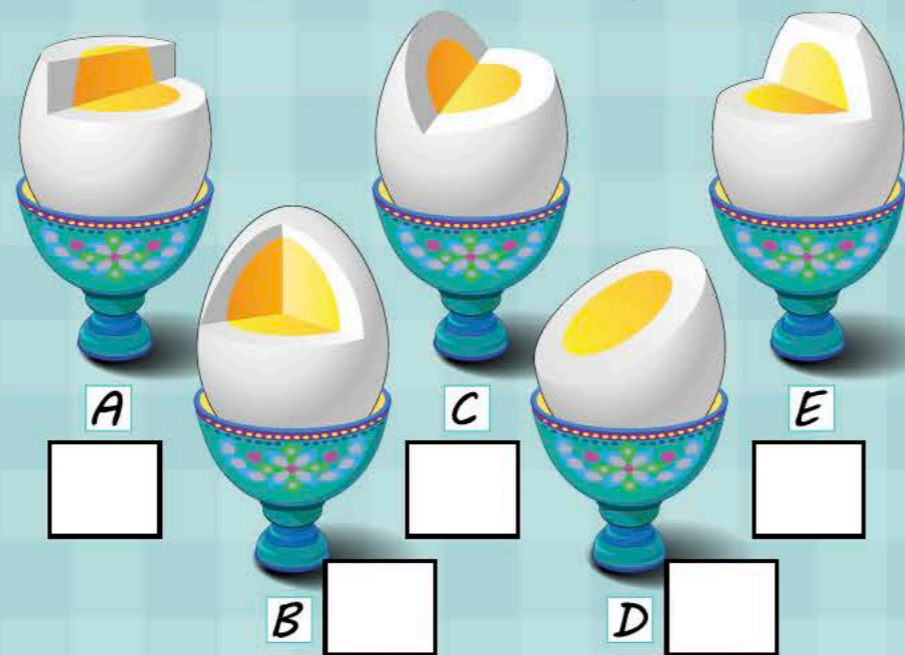

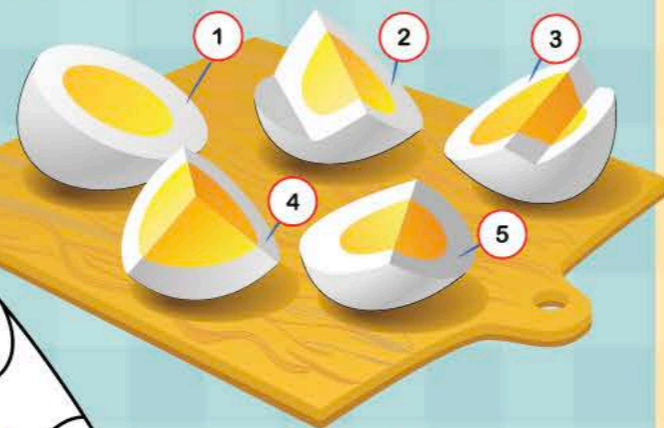

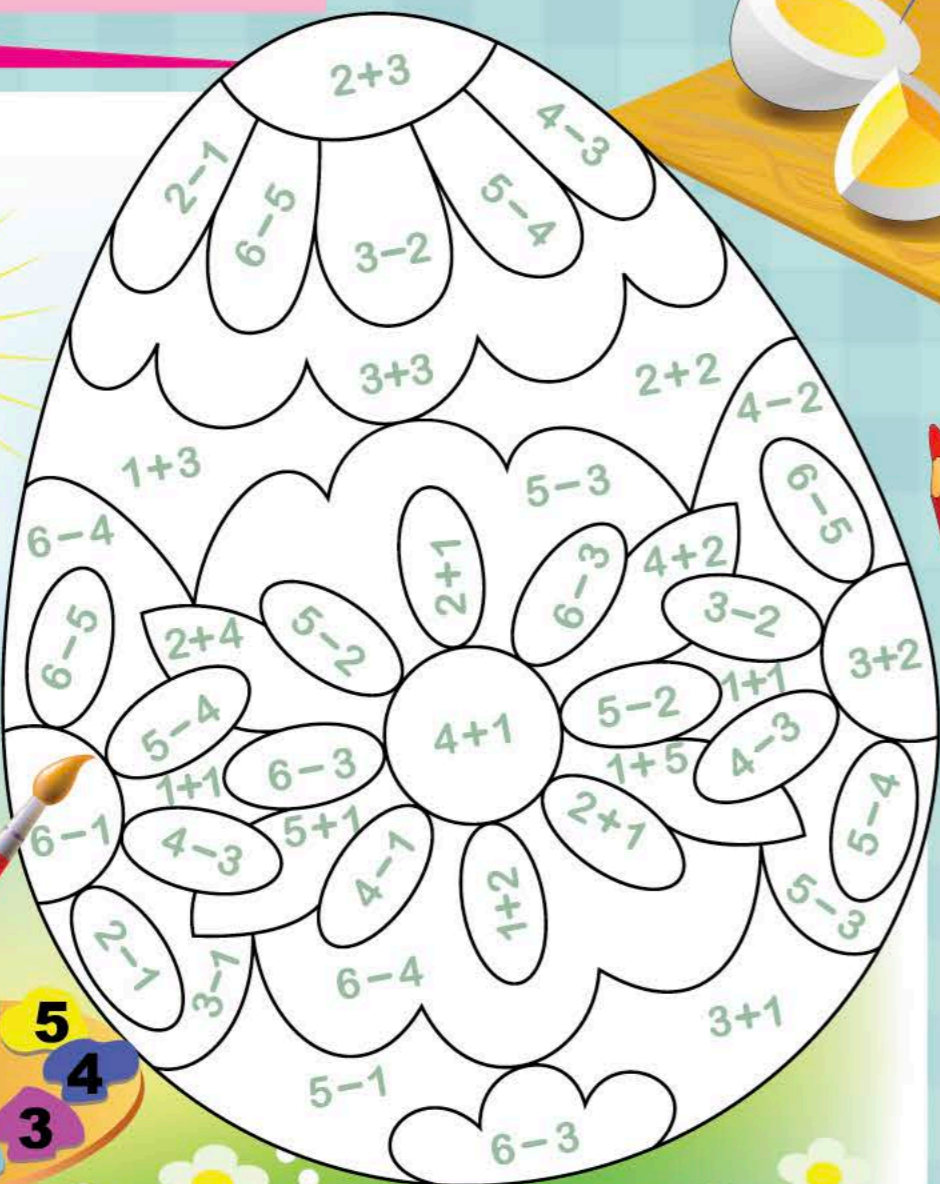
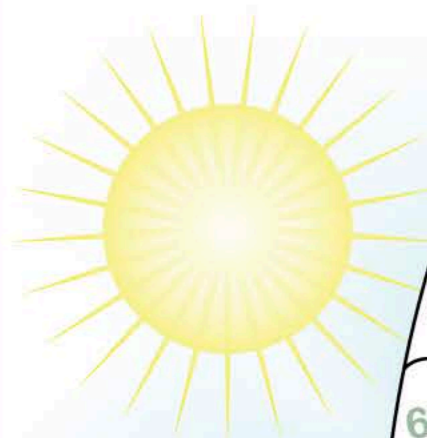
